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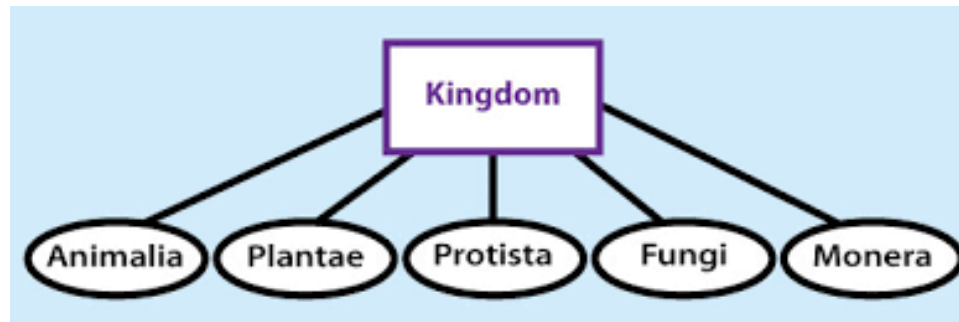

Conditions of FBIP Grants

- By signing with the NRF for acceptance of a grant, grantholders commit to comply with the conditions of the NRF grant inclusive of special FBIP conditions
- Grantholders and institutions agree to submit their data to the FBIP for public accessibility
- If projects involve the capture of third party data, all data owners must sign a consent form



Data dissemination

Data developed through FBIP projects will be made publicly available through:

- EoL
- CoL
- BOLD / GenBank
- GBIF network
- FBIP / SANBI portal



International formats & standards apply

Data dissemination

Temporary embargoes

- In the event of the open dissemination of data posing a risk to a student thesis, the data dissemination can be delayed for one to two years on request to the FBIP.



Sensitive data

- For sensitive data (eg. the GPS co-ordinates for a threatened species) GPS co-ordinates can be disseminated at a coarse scale
- For confidential data (eg. names of human subjects from whom disease samples were taken) names of human subjects must be removed from data sets



These restrictions must be stated by the grantholder when data are submitted to the FBIP
